Grant Funding Report

Stephanie reviewed the grants overview from funding coming in and out this year. Majority of funds have been for the NRCS-MCPI subaward agreements. A final invoice for DNRC agreement RD-SWCD-636 has been sent out and the new DNRC agreement for District Assistance (\$25,000 for Eric's time) is ready for signature by Rebecca.

BPMC Updates

Stephanie attended the BPMC's spring meeting on 03/11 in Bridger and gave an update:

- BPMC is currently working on hiring 4 seasonal employees and currently has one BSWC member.
- The Board of Managers discussed where we are in the process of adding WY to the deed and the LLC formation. It was previously recommended by our attorney that we wait until completely all the steps required by the merger before moving forward with these items since the name on all our agreements, leases, and the deed will need to be changed from SWCDM to MACD. It will likely be 2022 by the time the BPMC's new lease, deed amendments, and LLC formation is completed.
- Stephanie is working on ways to better showcase some of the publications BPMC has created regarding grass and pollinator plantings to CDs through social media and the website.
- It was discovered that we did not re-appoint Judi Knapp to the BPMC Board, as her term ended last November.
