Mark Bostrom at DNRC has said there is a 95% chance that they can cover up to \$5000 for leadership training and strategic planning. At Mark's request, Rebecca has sent a purchase order to DNRC for leadership training and strategic planning. Rebecca will be working with Amy Personnette from DNRC on this. Chris Evans mentioned that LCCD has some money from DNRC that could help cover leadership training.

Spring Board Meeting

The Spring Board Agenda has been updated. The main components of the agenda are MACD business, board leadership training, and hearing from state agency directors.

Partner Reports

Natural Resource Conservation Service (NRCS) - Tom Watson and Kyle Tackett

NRCS got five million dollars of EQIP and 2.5 million of CSP funding. They are still doing direct hiring. They are still doing watershed planning efforts and are still meeting with irrigators and the Farmer's Conservation Alliance.

Department of Natural Resources and Conservation (DNRC) - Amanda Kaster, Autumn Coleman, and Mary Hendrix

- There will be a CD Supervisor Training Module on the 310 Law on Wednesday (5/12) at 7am
- DNRC wants to make it a priority to fill positions in the Conservation Districts Bureau (CDB).
- Importance of a standalone CDB Chief
- HR Services - Where do staff go if they have an issue that they feel needs to be addressed outside their board? This is important for DNRC to consider and address
- DNRC staff who can answer straightforward legal questions
- There has been a lot of change in DNRC and the CARDD Division. Amanda sees this as a potential opportunity and wants to figure out the best way possible to serve conservation districts
- Message Conveyed by Autumn: Mark is very grateful for the help and support of MACD and individual districts during the legislative session. Because of the remote session and new administration, DNRC was not up at the legislature like they had been in the past, and the weekly

and sometimes daily communication with MACD and districts was critical. DNRC also feels that Jeff Tiberi did a phenomenal job!

DNRC Rangelands -Stacey Barta

There will be a Range and Livestock Forum at the end of the month in Billings

Resource Conservation Advisory Council (RCAC) - Gayla Wortman

RCAC has another round of grants to review later this month. They will be meeting in Helena to discuss how RCAC can elevate themselves into a different type of entity, as opposed to an entity that only looks at grants.

Missouri River Conservation District Council (MRCDC) - Steve Wanderaas

MRCDC is looking forward to meeting with Director Kaster tomorrow, alongside YRCDC. Liv Holt, the MRCDC coordinator has moved on, so they have interviewed applications and will offer a position on Wednesday. They are trying to get comments on the current EIS - Their main concern is that there is no mitigation for flooding or crop losses.

Yellowstone River Conservation District Council (YRCDC) - Judi Knapp

They will be meeting in Miles City on May 26th at 10am.

Milk River Watershed Alliance (MRWA)

MRWA is moving forward with MACD and NACD on making something happen related to the Pallid Sturgeon Resolution. There will be repairs on a couple small diversion projects on St. Marys. HJ7 was a great success thanks to MACD and DNRC. Sarah Hitchcock will be leaving MRWA, and the alliance will be looking for a new coordinator. Thank you to everyone for their support on Milk River efforts.

Montana Salinity Control Association (MSCA)

MSCA is doing lots of field work on its salinity RCPP. Rained out this morning from the weekend rains which is a good thing.
