Resolution to Reduce and Eliminate Geoengineering

BACKGROUND DESCRIBING ISSUE *

Geoengineering is used to try and cool the earth, remove certain gases, and control the amount of sunlight that reaches the Earth. The EPA shares that due to the nature of geoengineering there could be “unintended health and environmental consequences”. These risks range from respiratory issues, changing the amount of rain/snow fall totals, and negative effects to soil that ultimately affect crop yields and food that feeds Americans. Geoengineering is a threat not only to Montana but the world.

SPONSOR(S) ACTIONS TO DATE *

States across America are implementing policies that reduce and/or eliminate geoengineering. But VCCD is not aware of other state or local agencies that are calling for action to be taken.

LANGUAGE TO BE INCLUDED IN LEGISLATION DRAFTED BY MACD *

Encourage and support legislation at the state, local and federal level to report geoengineering activity and put the oversight, penalties, and public hearings in the power of the public service commission.

Cloud seeders should report activity to not only the public service commission but also the Department of Agriculture and the DNRC. Listing content of dispersals and flight logs. Ski resorts and other ground dispersal shall file a permit with local counties before work begins safe guarding down hill streams and aquifers.
